Watch Luthiers make new viola for RNCM collection

Last month, four of the country's finest instrument makers (William Castle, Helen Michetschläger, Kai-Thomas Roth, Marc Soubeyran) took over our concourse to build a brand new viola as part of the RNCM Strings Festival.

Made possible thanks to a generous bequest by Thomas Jellis, the finished viola is based on an instrument by the 18th century Venetian maker Anselmo Bellosio and (once varnished) will become part of our collection for loan to students.





Part of the process was broadcast live by <u>Classic FM</u> and viewed by over 80,000 people worldwide, and the Manchester Evening News also produced a short <u>video</u>.

New China partnership

Before Christmas we confirmed a new professional partnership with Zhejiang Conservatory of Music (ZJCM).

Situated in Hangzhou (the capital of China's Zhejiang Province), ZJCM officially opened in March 2016 and is dedicated to providing exceptional tuition to young musicians at undergraduate and postgraduate levels. Over the next three years, from immediate effect, RNCM and ZJCM students and staff will have the opportunity to experience both organisations through collaborative projects and curriculum initiatives, and student and teacher exchange programmes. Dame Barbara Woodward, British Ambassador to China, said of the partnership: 'The UK is forging strong links with China, not just economically but artistically and creatively too. It is wonderful to see that the RNCM, one of the world's leading music colleges, has embarked on a new partnership with Zhejiang Conservatory of Music, providing young musicians



both in the UK and in China the opportunity to experience the highest level of musical training in such culturally inspiring environments.'


Towards Vocal Freedom

Towards Vocal Freedom: Alexander Technique and the Use of the Singing Voice by alumnus Gerald Wragg has been published by Mouritz.

Gerald, who died in 2012, studied piano at the Royal Manchester College of Music in the 1950s where he accompanied Frederic Cox's singing classes and began a life-long passion for the voice. He worked in Rome and London, as Senior Tutor of Vocal Studies at Leeds College of Music and, latterly, as Head of Opera at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama. His teaching incorporated the bel canto tradition

and the Alexander Technique to develop poise, breath control and vocal freedom.

The book has been prepared for publication by Malcolm Williamson (Tutor in Alexander Technique) and is available from <u>mouritz.co.uk</u> and <u>Amazon</u> priced £14.99.
